

Correspondence of the Union.

PLACERVILLE, June 9th, 1851.

MR. EDITOR, Major Rogers with the forces under his command, passed through this city yesterday, on their return from the expedition beyond Georgetown, having succeeded in effectually clearing that part of the country of the enemy. The Indians have all fled south towards the Cosumnes, where they are said now to be in force. Major Hall with the command of Major Graham, marches this morning for the Cosumnes: Major Rogers intending to follow with the main body on Wednesday next. The men who have been with Major Rogers on the expedition beyond Georgetown, are very much worn down with the toil of marching through the exceedingly rough and mountainous country where they have been; and the Major has determined to give them a couple of days rest before starting for the Cosumnes.

Col. Bigler favored us with his presence on Friday last, and gave a speech in the evening. The Colonel did not equal the expectation that had been formed of him here, as a
