

DESPERATE INDIAN FIGHT.—We have just received the intelligence of another fight with the Indians, which, judging from the number of casualties, has scarcely had its equal during the war. We regret that we are unable to give the particulars more fully.

The fight occurred between a detachment of soldiers under the command of Lieut. Middleton of Company C, C. M., and a band of Trinity Indians.

We are not informed where this fight took place, nor of the numbers engaged.

Lieut. Middleton lost three of his men, killed on the field. The Indians received severe punishment from the Lieut. and his men, having had eleven killed.—*Humboldt Times, 21st.*
