

STATE MILITIA.—The law relative to the State militia levies a military poll tax of two dollars upon each male inhabitant of the State over the age of twenty-one years. The volunteer or independent companies shall be armed or equipped as are similar corps in the United States army; and shall have not less than thirty nor more than eighty privates each. The Supervisors of each county shall provide for the companies in their respective counties an armory, drill room, and armorer, provided the cost per company does not exceed fifty dollars per month, which sums shall be allowed to the counties by the State Treasurer in the annual settlement. The companies shall drill at least once a month. The sum of \$300 is allowed annually to the officers of each company, to be used for such purpose in connection with the company as they may see fit.
