

INDIAN WAR CLAIMS.—The Board of Commissioners "to examine and adjust all claims for services rendered or supplies furnished in the suppression of Indian hostilities, in the counties of Klamath, Siskiyou, and Humboldt, during the years 1851, 1852, 1853, 1854, and 1855," meets at Orleans Bar on the first Monday in July, next. We learn this from a notice published in the Crescent City Herald, signed by Walter McDonald and E. J. Curtis, Commissioners, and we give it one insertion gratis, in order that our merchants, and others, here, and readers on the Klamath and Salmon, interested, may be advised of the fact. The gentlemen named must have forgotten the fact that Humboldt county is included in the provisions of the act referred to, and that there is a paper published in said county which, in addition to the circulation in its own county, has a larger subscription in that portion of Klamath particularly interested in this matter, than any other paper. Mr. McDonald, who resides on the Klamath, certainly ought to know that the people of Klamath and Salmon do their business in this direction, and take this paper, and that there is no business carried on between Orleans Bar and Crescent City, the two places being separated by "impassable mountains."
