The scamps were followed up so closely, however, that the cattle were recovered before they had killed them, but not until they had fired several arrows in them.

It is pretty certain that as long as there is a redskin remaining in the Bald Hills the property of our frontier settlers will be subject to their plunder. This being the case is it not clearly the duty of all good citizens to unite in efforts to rid the county of such a withering curse? If one plan fails let us try another, but never rest till the object is accomplished.
