

Indian Outbreak in the North.

On June 12th a man reached Antelope Mills, twenty-five miles east of the town of Red Bluffs; says the *Beacon* of the latter place, and reported that a man had been murdered by the Indians that morning. It seems that two men lived in a cabin, some three miles from the mill, who were engaged in making shingles in the Pinery. One of the men went out a little distance from the cabin to a deer-lick to hunt. The remaining one heard the report of a gun, and on looking in the direction spoken of, saw a body of 75 Indians rushing towards his cabin. He fled to procure assistance, and when he returned found his partner horribly mutilated by the savages. After murdering him they had cut off his right arm and carried it away.

Several of the citizens of Red Bluffs at once started for the scene, determined to chastise the Indians. This party shortly afterwards returned, and brought news that they had encountered about two hundred Indians about four miles above Laysen's cabin, on the immigrant trail, in Mill-Creek Cañon, where they had a rancheria. The scouting party, fifteen in number, made an attack upon them about daylight on Monday morning, June 15th. The Indians stood their ground, and were armed with rifles. Mr. Chaffee was shot through the hat; the bullet hole was large enough to stick one's finger through. He was also shot in the foot. A Mr. Johnson was struck in the hat by a bullet. Another man was shot in the arm. The party of whites then retreated towards Antelope Mills, followed by the savages, who kept up a constant firing. Mr. Chaffee thinks that at least fifty Indians were killed and wounded.

About fifty of the citizens of Red Bluffs were to start from that place on Wednesday, the 17th of June, for the scene of action. The first party of whites had tracked the Indians from the spot where they had killed the man two days before. The *Beacon* learns from Simeon Oldom, that another outbreak of the Indians is anticipated in the Pitt river region. Mr. Oldom says, that on the morning of 7th June, Lieut. Crooks, of Capt. Judah's command, went out with four regulars and a guide, to a point some twenty-five miles above the ferry on Pitt river, and came suddenly upon a rancheria; when the savages saw them, they at once ran, and in passing the whites a firing was commenced, in which Lieut. Crooks was shot with an arrow in the leg, the point of the arrow was broken off in pulling out, making it very painful, though not a dangerous wound. They killed three Indians and took one prisoner. Some days before, a party of the so-called Jack's Indians stole some cattle above that and near the Yreka road. They were pursued and one of them killed. The cattle were not recovered. Mr. Oldom thinks that Lieut. Crooks is the true grit, and is determined to thrash them soundly or drive them beyond the limits where they have committed so many depredations.
