

**ANOTHER WHITE MAN MURDERED BY
INDIANS IN THIS COUNTY.**—We find the
following in the San Francisco *Herald*:

Big River, June 20, 1861.

EDITOR OF THE HERALD:—I have just
been informed by Mr. Hamilton that Mr.
Wm. Oliver, of Point Arenas, was killed
by the Indians at Shelter Cove, day be-
fore yesterday. The Indians had previ-
ously killed a man in the employ of Mess.
Hamilton and Oliver, upon their stock
ranch at Shelter Cove. The party at-
tacked by the Indians consisted of three,
Mr. Hamilton, Justice of the Peace of
Point Arenas, Wm. H. Oliver, his part-
ner and brother-in-law, and Mr. S. Smith,
who has a stock ranch near Shelter Cove.
Mr. Smith was armed with a revolver,
with which he succeeded in killing at
least two of the Indians, and keeping
them at bay until Hamilton could get
hold of Oliver's horse, with which the
two succeeded in escaping. Hamilton
and Smith both lost their horses and sad-
dles, and were very glad to get off at
that. Mr. Oliver's body is still in the
hands of the Indians.

A party of citizens will leave the Noyo
this morning in pursuit of and to chas-
tise the Indians. Lieut. Dillon, at Fort
Bragg, has been informed of the occur-
rence and will send out a party of U. S.
soldiers as soon as possible.

Mr. Oliver was one of our best and
most worthy citizens and dies regretted
by all. He leaves an interesting family
to mourn his loss, who will receive the
sympathy of all who know them.
