

MAD RIVER INDIANS.—Sam. King' just in from Bel river, informs us that the Indians have made an outbreak, and that the trail to Humboldt Bay is not safe to travel. Some days since the whites pursued some depredators, and killed twelve of them, on Mad river. A while before Mr. Sanborn was pursued by the red devils, and has ceased to travel the trail.
