

*** FURTHER FROM PITT RIVER.**—The Yreka *Union*
of July 9th, says:

We learn from Mr. S. Lockhart, who arrived in town on Sunday last, that on Saturday, the 4th inst., a white man was shot by the Indians, about four miles from the military post. He had been in Mr. L.'s employment, cutting hay, and being unwell, went to the fort in the morning for some medicine, and, on his return, was shot in the breast with three arrows. He was not killed, and it was not known whether the wounds were likely to prove mortal or not. Several teams arrived from below on Monday, with goods for our merchants. The teamsters report the road in good traveling condition.
