

FROM FORT BAKER.—Col. Whipple has received information from Capt. Long to the effect that a scouting party, under Lieut. Geor, had come upon a large band of Indians, well armed and partly mounted, in the vicinity of the heads of Willow and Redwood creeks. Lieut. Geor not deeming it prudent to attack so large a force with a handful of men, took a position with his command where he could watch them, and dispatched a messenger to Capt. Long for assistance. Lieut. Beckwith left camp immediately with a force sufficient to give the Indians battle, and expected to reach Lt. Geor at daylight on the 20th inst. Since that time nothing has been heard from the command, but next week we expect to be able to lay before our readers an interesting account of the expedition.
