

REMOVAL.—It is the intention of Col. Lippitt, we are informed, to have the Indian prisoners removed from Fort Humboldt to the peninsula opposite. The Col. is obliged to adopt this course to prevent the Indians from escaping, as well as from sanitary considerations. The Indians are cooped in at the Fort in a small inclosure, which deprives them of their usual exercise;—the food also is different from that they are accustomed to and they are beginning to die off in consequence. They have already become much frightened at the prospect before them, and will soon make desperate efforts to escape to the mountains unless a change be made. A sufficient guard will be placed over them on the peninsula, and means will be taken to render them comparatively contented until removed out of the county by the Indian Agent.
