

HOUSE ROBBED BY INDIANS ON BEAR RIVER.—Again we are called upon to state that the Indians have made another successful raid. On Monday the 25th inst., they entered the house of Mr. Hawley, on Bear River ridge, and robbed it of its contents. He had just stepped out to visit a neighbor—Mr. S. Morrison—about a quarter of a mile distant. The Indians were seen by Mr. Johnson and family who live about half a mile from Hawley's, but in sight of it. They noticed five.—By this raid the Indians have come in possession of two more guns. They also got thirty dollars and two pairs of blankets.
