

~~Indian Losses. How, with the at-~~  
tention of all parties interested, to an  
Act passed May 16th 1861, providing for  
the payment of losses sustained by Indi-  
an depredations. Efforts have been made  
to abolish the Board of Examiners, whose  
duty it is to audit and allow all just  
claims for services rendered, supplies fur-  
nished, or losses sustained by Indian dep-  
redations against the U. S. Government;  
and should this be done there would be  
no recourse left for parties who have  
small claims which will not warrant them  
in going to Sacramento and buying up  
the lobby. Therefore all who are inter-  
ested in this matter, should see that their  
claims are in proper shape before another  
session of the Legislature meets. All  
parties, whose claims are allowed, re-  
ceive State bonds for the amount due  
them, to be paid out of the first appro-  
priation made by Congress for this pur-  
pose.
