

ARRIVAL OF THE ADVANCE IMMIGRATION.
From Placerville the Sacramento Union has
intelligence of the first arrival of the immi-
gration by the way of the plains. The influx
as already reported, will be larger this year
than at any previous period since 1852. This
includes a great many wagons and about
twenty thousand head of loose stock, all in
good order. The most gratifying feature of
the news is the incorrectness of the rumor
that the advance to the immigration had been
cut off by Indian. The cause of the deten-
tion appears to have been a scarcity of grass
soon after starting. The Indians were some-
what troublesome on the Humboldt, but they
were prompted by a desire to steal and not to
murder. There was no suffering of any ac-
count from any cause.
