

HELD BY INDIANS.—The Mendocino Herald says that one Matlock, a hunter, who spends much of his time in the northern Indian country, has obtained information that a white woman is held a prisoner by the Indians of North Eel River, some eighty miles north of Mendocino. The woman and her little girl were captured in some of the northern counties, her husband having been killed at the same time. She has once tried to escape, but in the attempt was shot in the arm, breaking it, and the Indians amputated it above the elbow.
