

~~THE~~ THE *Yreka Herald*, of 30th July, says that a party of eleven left there on Wednesday the 20th, to recover stock stolen by the Indians from Shasta Valley, and to chastize the Indians not only for that but for former offenses. The party returned on the 26th, and reported that after having found the trail they followed it until they came within sight of the Indian camp. The Indians were trying the speed of their newly acquired plunder. The whites remained in sight of the Indians unobserved by the latter, until dark. Five of the party then reconnoitered the Indian camp; they then removed to about one quarter of a mile of the Indians, where they left two men in charge of the animals. They proceeded close to the Indian camp and remained concealed until day, when they attacked them, picked ~~a man each with their rifles, and then pitched in~~ with revolvers. There were about from 20 to 25 killed, and but five escaped.

They recovered two mules and one mare and colt, out of eleven that were stolen. The remainder the Indians had killed and eaten. They represent these Indians to be a very fine-looking people.
