The National Tax Bill.

The New York Herald of the 26th of
June publishes the National Tax Bill in
extenso. We reproduce so much of the
items as will prove of most interest to
the people of California. The law is to
go into effect on the 1st of August. The
income tax will become due on the 1st of
May, 1863, and is to be levied on the in-
come for the year preceding:

Advertisements in any newspaper or
periodical are exempt when the gross re-
ceipts of such papers are less than \$1,000
—over that 3 per cent.; in newspapers

exceeding 10,000 dollars, on the excess
over 600 dollars, 3 per cent.; exceeding
10,000 dollars and not exceeding 50,000
on excess over 600, 5 per cent.; exceed-
ing 50,000, 7 per cent.; annual income
from property of any kind in the United
States, realized by any citizen of the
United States residing abroad, and not
in the employ of the United States Gov-
ernment, 5 per cent.

Insurance companies, on all dividends,
3 per cent.; on gross receipts for premi-
ums and assessments, 1 per cent.; for-
eign companies doing business in the
United States, 3 per cent. Policy of in-
surance, 25 cents.
