MR. CHAIRMAN, GOVERNOR OF THE NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY, MY FELLOW-CITIZENS— I received a telegraphic message at Baltimore, at three o'clock this day, that the nomination tendered him by the Democratic Convention, and that it was desired of me to accept it. It is scarcely mentioned in Baltimore in connection with this occasion, and that I persistently refused to consent to it, but I can truthfully argue that if Georgia were to be thus honored, it was due to another of her sons, most distinguished for his talents and great public services.

This was my earnest desire, and I was glad of the delegation of which I was a member. But the Convention in its wisdom deemed it best to nominate a statesman of Alabama. It was entirely satisfactory. Alabama is the child of Georgia, and the mother cordially responds to any compliment bestowed upon her daughter. These are the circumstances under which I have been assigned this distinguished position, and which demand that discrimination should yield to the voice of duty.
