

INDIAN FIGHTERS FOR ANTELOPE CREEK.—A company has been organized at Red Bluffs, under Brigadier General Wm. C. Kibbe, to chastise Indians who have, for some time past, been committing depredations on Antelope Creek, in Tehama county. One of the fighters, who went from this county, sends the following list of officers chosen for the campaign: John P. Jones, Private Secretary to Gen. Kibbe; Wm. Burns, Captain; Robert Bailey, 1st Lieutenant; H. Van Shell, 2d Lieut.; John McCarty, Brevet; A. W. Elwes, Orderly Sergeant; John D. Ludwig, 2d Sergeant; Wm. H. Nutall, 3d Sergeant; W. Wilson, 4th Sergeant; John Marshall, 1st Corporal. The company left for Antelope Creek on Wednesday, the 17th. John Olvany, Patrick Tobin, John McCarty, H. Van Shell, William Irwin and John D. Ludwig, who served under Capt. Messer in the late Humboldt campaign, are members of the company. They style themselves the "Kibbe Rangers."
