A correspondent of the Express, writing from Indian Bar, North Fork of Feather river, says:


Of late the litt River Indians have become somewhat troublesome at Beckwith's Valley; they have stolen stock from the rauch of Messrs. Brown & Co., of that place, and likewise from the ranch 18 miles distant, kept by Dickson & Brother. Not being satisfied with pilfering, they surrounded the house last inentioned, numbering about a hundred strong, with the intent of murdefing the inmates, numbering in all three, one of whom was an immigrant, who had merely called in leaving his horse at the door; he thinking the quarters too hot, quickly mounted his steed and fled, receiving a few arrows in the rear, none of which took effect; the remaining two nobly defended themselves with their muskets in hand until the notorious Jim Beckwith, accompanied with one other, happened to ride up, at the sight of whom the Indiana fied.

The Indians of this neighborhood, although peaceable, are complaining greatly on account of the salmon not coming up as usual. It is said that the
flumes below hinder them, and it is feared by many
that it will have a tendency to leave, property and

even life very insecure.
