

### Indian Reservation Notice.

**B**y virtue of power vested in me by an Act of Congress, approved April 8th 1864, and acting under instructions from the Interior Department dated at Washington City, D. C., April 26th 1864, concerning the location of four tracts of land for Indian Reservations in the State of California, I do hereby proclaim and make known to all concerned, that I have this day located an Indian Reservation, to be known and called by the name and title of the Hoopa Valley Reservation, said Reservation being situated on the Trinity river, in Klamath county California, to be described by such metes and bounds as may hereafter be established by order of the Interior Department, subject to the approval of the President of the United States.

Settlers in Hoopa Valley are hereby notified not to make any further improvements upon their places, as they will be appraised and purchased as soon as the Interior Department may direct.
