

TELEGRAPHIC DISPATCH FROM GOV. WELLER.—Mr. Burch, our State Senator, has received a dispatch from Gov. Weller, informing him that the Constitution gives the Executive power to call out volunteers to suppress Indian outbreaks, and that he would use his authority in that respect whenever he should be furnished with the necessary evidence of such an outbreak in this section.

The evidence was furnished two weeks since, in the shape of a petition for assistance, and was addressed to the Governor through the Weaver mail, on the 16th inst; but, either through the carelessness or stupidity of the post master at Weaver, it came back to Union, in the mail of the 21st. We tried it by the same route again.
