More Indian Difficulties.—A company of dragoons from Camp Floyd, numbering about fifty men, under Lieutenant Gay, passed through this city on the 10th inst., for the purpose of protecting the emigrants on the Northern route, and punishing the Indians for their recent outrage in that region, if they could be found.

On Sunday morning an express came in, on the way to General Johnston, with the intelligence that Lieutenant Gay was attacked by the Indians in Box Elder Canon, Friday evening, just as he was encamping for the night, who killed and wounded several men and killed and drove off some twenty horses. Yesterday (Tuesday) in the afternoon, another company, under command of Lieutenant Gordon, passed northward to support Lieutenant Gay, but there are strong suspicions that the rumor of the attack was all a hoax or greatly exaggerated, as from Dr. Forney's report the Indians had left that section of country several days before the alleged encounter.
