

THE INDIANS.—The Commanding General of the Pacific Division has ordered a force of sixty U. S. troops to Fort Reading, to be employed, under the direction of Col. Wright, against the Rogue River Indians. The latest accounts from the north represent the Indians, in all the region along the line between California and Oregon, as hostile to the white settlers, and united in their efforts to annihilate them. Mr James McMahon, a citizen of Klamath county, and who represented that county in the last Legislature, has made a call, in San Francisco, for sixty volunteers, each to be armed, if possible, with a rifle and a Colt's revolver, to accompany him to the seat of war. He says that the Indians have now concentrated their forces, and are determined to expel the whites from that portion of the country.


