

SMALL POX.—The small pox is prevailing extensively among the Indian tribes in this region, and the mortality is considerable. Many of the females that pass through this city have their heads in mourning, (i. e.) covered with a mixture of pine gum and powdered charcoal—which they wear till it wears off—about a year—in memory of the dead. The Indians seem generally very low spirited in consequence of the sickness among them.
