

ANOTHER MAN SHOT BY INDIANS.—On Wednesday last a man by the name of McNutt, a citizen of Mattole valley was shot by Indians, while on his way from the Upper to the Lower valley. He was near the settlements when he was fired upon and succeeded in reaching a house alive. He was shot through the body, and was not expected to live when a messenger left there for a doctor, since which time nothing has been heard from him. Recently the Indians in that vicinity are becoming quite troublesome, and unless some assistance be speedily rendered we shall hear of more murders in that vicinity. There are but few Indians there, and a small detachment of the right kind of men would give security to life and property. We learn that Col. Whipple has been petitioned for help, which he will surely render as soon as it is possible for him to do so.
