

REMOVAL OF TROOPS.—Fort Lyon, Capt. Harry Flynn, has been abandoned, and the command been ordered, we believe, to report at Fort Baker. Fort Anderson, on Redwood, Capt. Douglas, has been ordered to be abandoned, but, upon the representation that the mails between Arcata and Weaverville, which had been in service for nearly five years, must be stopped if the post is abandoned, Col. Lippitt has decided to station a detachment there for the protection of the mail. The Orleans and Sawyer's Bar mail also passes that way now, as the Bald-Hill settlements have all been destroyed by Indians. Fort Anderson is half way between Arcata and Hoopa, and the distance is too great to be traveled in one day, in the winter or fall season. It is well that there should be a post there, in fact all communications with Hoopa by mail, or otherwise, must cease unless that point is protected, and a stopping place afforded for man and beast.
