

INDIANS AT FORT HUMBOLDT.—Captain Lovell has received notice—in answer to his inquiry—that the Agent in charge of the Indian Reservation at the mouth of the Klamath, will receive and provide for the Indians which are now at Fort Humboldt. We have heard that Capt. Buhe was to have taken them up before this, but has been prevented by unfavorable weather. Their removal ought not to be delayed, and with them should be sent all the half-tamed coast Indians of this country. It is for the interest of both races that the Indians should be taken to the home which has been provided for them by Government. Their continued presence here is a disadvantage to the white inhabitants and will inevitably eventuate in disaster to the inferior race.
