

W E are informed by a gentleman just from Humboldt, that the Indians set fire to the barn of Hank Young, on the South Fork of Cottonwood, on Sunday night, August 18th, and destroyed it, together with about 1800 bushels of wheat and a large hay stack. The loss is estimated between three and four thousand dollars. A very valuable stallion which some gentleman from this county was taking over to Humboldt, would have suffered in the flames had the fire taken place a few hours sooner.—*Northern Argus.*
