Gambrel, McLaughlin and others.—The aborigines were loaded into wagons, and their bows, arrows and yagers taken from them, and themselves trotted off in the presence of numerous anxious spectators. The poor creatures looked sad and down hearted at leaving their old home, and went away most unwillingly. It is the determination of the agent, Mr. Titus, to "corral" all the natives in that vicinity.
