

INDIAN HOSTILITIES IN TRINITY AND HUMBOLDT COUNTIES. — We understand, says the *Sacramento Mercury*, that Gen. Clarke, commanding Pacific Division, although absent from this State, looking after the Indian hostilities in Oregon and Washington Territories, has vied with our Government in promptness of action to open the communication between the inner counties and Humboldt Bay. He has ordered a considerable force upon the road from the coast to Yreka and Weaverville, which, if found adequate, will not require the measures already taken by Governor Weller for the security of life and property in the North, whose orders to raise a State force are predicated only upon the necessity to protect our citizens.
