SOLDIERS ROUTED—A detachment of twenty soldiers under Lieut. Noyes was surprised by a party of eighty Indians in the violity of Grouse creek and upper Mad river, four miles from the Trinity trail, on the 8th. The Lieutenant's mule was shot from under him, and Sergeaut Connell received a shot in the foot. The Indians having the advantage of both position and superior numbers, compelled the soldiers to retreat. This we learn from the Humboldt Times.
