

FOR THE MOUNTAINS.—Capt. Lovell left Fort Humboldt on Thursday with a force of about sixty men for Yager Creek. The Captain is to select the site for the new military post, establish, and occupy it, until relieved. We are informed that this movement was delayed only on the account of the large number of Indians which had been gathered at Fort Humboldt, preparatory to their removal to the Reservation. Lieut. Lynn and Asst. Surgeon Shorb remain at the Fort with fifteen men.

The establishment of this post in the interior was much needed and will unquestionably tend in a great measure to the subjugation of the hostile Indians. Settlements will spring up in the vicinity, and the Indians must cease depredating, and other quarters, or be killed off.
