

STORMING A RANCHERIA.—A party of Indian hunters being on the look-out for the murderers of McCarty, last week and being unsuccessful in their hunt in the mountains, came to the valley and attacked the camp at Jelly's Ranch. At the first fire two white men who were sleeping in the rancheria emerged from among the thatch-work of brush and grass, that formed the huts and so surprised the hunters that in their bewilderment they only succeeded in killing one old Indian.
