

THE INDIANS IN BUTTE COUNTY.—The
Marysville Appeal says:

We learn from Superintendent Han-
son that about 600 Indians have been
collected at Pence's ranch, Butte county,
under the recent order of the citizens'
meeting. Of these about 50 are sick,
some nigh unto death, with a kind of
bilious intermittent fever. Thirty of the
poor creatures have died within the last
three weeks. Mr. Hanson intends to be-
gin the work of removing them to Round
Valley early the coming week. It would
be better, he thinks, to take them up the
coast, but the cost would be at least \$9-
000—fully a third of the whole appropri-
ation for the ordinary expenses of his
district.
