INDIANS CAPTURED.—On the 3d inst. Maj. Taylor, with Co. B, "Mountaineers," surrounded the "Mantiltan" ranchile-Hoopa Valley, and captured one hundred and twenty Indians—men, woman and children. The immediate cause of this descent was suspicion that the murderers of Madame Weaver and Merrick sojourned at the ranch. Maj. Taylor gave the chief of the tribe three days time to deliver up the murderers, failing to do which he took the whole gang prisoners. In attempting to escape one Indian was killed and another badly crippled. A number of guns, many bows and arrows, and any quanti-of scalping knives were taken.
