

THE KLAMATH LAKE INDIANS.—The  
Yreka Journal of September 12th re-  
marks:  
During the last three or four days the  
Klamath Lake tribe of Indians have  
been sojourning about town. Every time  
they come here the Shasta and Scott Val-  
ley Indians make their appearance and  
show pretensions of fight. It looks bad,  
if not dangerous to see them prowling  
about town with their rifles on their  
shoulders, and we think it would be a  
good move for the authorities to prevent  
them from carrying firearms through  
town or making hostile demonstrations in  
its immediate vicinity. The Klamath  
tribe do considerable trading, which  
probably amounts to \$6,000 or 8,000 a  
year, but the annoyance of the Shastas  
about here causes them to go to Jackson-  
ville of late.
