

~~INDIANS RETURNING - WHAT IS TO BE~~  
7 ~~DONE WITH THEM?~~—The Indians that  
r were removed to the Klamath Reserva-  
s tion last spring are pretty much all back  
again. At first they slipped off stealthi-  
ly and returned in small parties; but  
l within the last two weeks they have  
come in droves. It is estimated that  
e over a hundred and fifty have passed  
down towards their old quarters on low-  
l er Eel river, and we understand there are  
quite a number on North Beach. We  
3 have endeavored to learn the cause of  
l their leaving the Reservation, but with-  
o out success. We hear it said that in  
y consequence of the small amount appro-  
; priated for the Indian service on this  
f coast, at the last session of Congress, the  
s Agent is unable to subsist these Indians  
n any longer. If this is so it is not the  
v fault of the Agent, but it would have  
g been better had it been made known so  
e that our people could have taken some  
y steps in the premises before they were  
l allowed to come back among us. As it  
t is the trouble of collecting them together  
n and sending them off has been all labor  
5 lost.  
r  
y If no other Indians than those original-  
y ly on the Klamath river can be taken  
r care of at that Reservation it is of very  
o little use.  
e Those Indians have provided a living  
t for themselves, for ages, and require no  
i governmental aid to support them. It is  
x to take care of such as are taken there  
e from the surrounding country, which is  
being settled by white people, that the  
Reservation can only return an equiva-  
l lent for the expense of keeping it up.  
, Those whose business it is to look to that  
f Reservation we hope will be able to ex-  
plain this matter. From present appear-  
ances it looks as though we were to have  
a renewal of Indian troubles in this coun-  
ty, for experience has demonstrated that  
e the two races cannot live together. These  
a Indians must be removed again—there is  
t no other alternative. If they cannot be  
f kept at the Klamath Reservation, they  
must be taken elsewhere.
