

INDIAN AFFAIRS.—Col. T. J. Henley, Superintendent of Indian Affairs for California, has established a reservation in the northern part of Colusa county, on the head-waters of Thorne's Creek, about thirty miles from Tehama. The location is represented by Mr. V. E. Geiger, Sub-Agent, as in every way eligible—remote from white settlements—and extremely well adapted to the pursuits of agriculture. A large colony of Indians, with all the means and appliances of agricultural life, will soon be located on this northern reservation, where the same discipline, found so beneficial at the Tejon, will be instituted.—*Marysville Herald.*
