

LYNCH LAW.—Some week's ago Messrs. Roskill & Co.'s store at Union, was entered; three Golt's navy pistols and twenty-eight dollars in coin was taken; a few days since the pistols were found in the possession of Cuffee, a Pattewot river Indian, who was arrested and brought to Union.—On Saturday night he was taken out, by a party of citizens, who shaved off his hair and administered twenty-five lashes on his bare back. He stood the lash like a stoic.—The chief of the tribe was present and proposed that the whites should cut off his ears. Cuffee has heretofore had more influence with the northern tribes than any other Indian in this State—but now he has lost "caste," and degraded with the Indians to the rank and position of a woman.—He speaks five languages.
