

INDIANS FROM THE RESERVATION.—In last week's issue we noted the fact that quite a large number of Indians had returned from the Klamath reservation, and that the agent was at that time in this county to take them back, if such was the wish of the citizens. Col. Buel found some opposition where he expected cordial assistance, and that to carry out his first intentions would involve a greater expense than he was prepared for. He has therefore postponed further action in the matter for the present. It is difficult for us to believe that any considerable number of our people desire that the Indians should remain, or that others should return (which will most certainly be the case should these again become settled here,) but circumstances indicate that there are individuals who would, to subserve a selfish end, use their influence against the peace and prosperity of the county, and attempt to hinder the officers of government in the discharge of their duty.
