

SICKNESS AMONG INDIANS.—A tribe of Indians, numbering some forty or fifty, have been encamped near Nevada for several months, and five or six deaths have occurred among them during last week and the week previous. The bodies were burned near the camp, and several families living in the vicinity were considerably annoyed by the occurrence. A rumor was also started that the Indians were dying with the small pox, which produced considerable excitement in town, although it was soon ascertained that there was no truth in the report. A meeting of the Town Trustees was held on Thursday evening, and measures taken to have them removed to some other locality; but they left of their own accord on Friday morning.
