

~~The Murderers of Wigmore.~~ The two Indians who sometime since were arrested by Capt. Judah, U. S. A., one of whom confesses the murder (he declares he did it in self defence) are still held in confinement at Fort Humboldt, awaiting the requisition of the civil authorities who decline taking action in the matter. The U. S. authorities have no right to try them for a violation of the law of a sovereign State, and consequently the question arises—what shall be done with them? We think the citizens of Weott River might solve it, and speedily, by getting a warrant issued by some justice of the peace, demand them of the Col. commanding at Fort Humboldt, and appoint a judge to try them; if guilty, punish them; if innocent, let them go.—We saw them on Tuesday the elder showed us a rifle wound on his head which he says was fired by Wigmore, and for which he killed him. The younger is a very intelligent boy, who is said to be innocent. The white man who was charged with complicity in the murder has fled.

The Superintendent of Indian Affairs should attend to the case of these poor fellows.
