\* Obtained from a report of the secretary of state of California, on the Census of 1852, in which they are designated as "domesticated Indians." Superintendent Beale, in November, 1852, estimated the Indian population of California at from 75,000 to 100,000. Commissioners Barbour and Wozencraft, in March, 1851, 200,000 to 300,000, though their colleague, Redick McKee, esq., at the same time stated that he had information which would greatly reduce that number. And the Spanish missionary authorities reported it to be, in 1802, 82,281. The census of the State of California is believed to be the most reliable.
