Fight with the Indians North - Eight | Killed and Five Wounded.

WEAVERVILLE, Nov. 1st.

The volunteer company under Capt. Messick had a fight with the Indians, killing eight and wounding five, two of whom have since died. One white man was wounded:

AFFAIRS AT YREKA. The following intelligence is chronicled in the Union, of the 28th of October:

In Yreka District, No. 1, we learn that there are one hundred and twenty-eight children between the age of four and eighteen years; one hundred and ninety under four years; making a total of two hundred and thirty-six. Of this number one hundred and twenty-nine were born in California.

In Hawkinsville District, No. 2, there are thirty-seven children between four and eighteen years of age; twenty-one under four years; total, fifty-eight. Of this number twenty-two were born in California.

In South District, No. 4, there are sixty-three children between four and eighteen years of age; seventy under four years; total, one hundred and thirty-three. Of this number seventy-four were born in California.

We are informed that about four hundred rations are distributed at Fort Crook, in Pitt river Valley, which is comparatively free from settlement, while about one hundred Indians, of Shasta and Scott Valleys, are left to forage on the whites for subsistence. Their lands are offered for sale, and have, in fact, long been in
