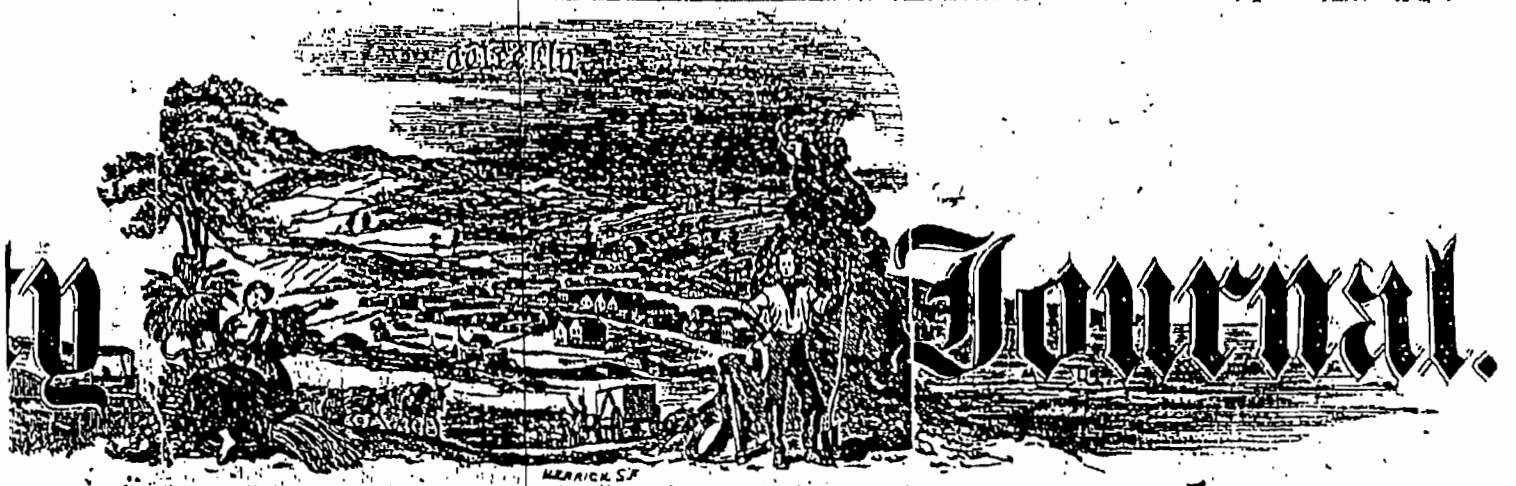


**TERRIBLE RETRIBUTION.**—The Red Bluff *Beacon* and other lower country papers publish accounts of a late Indian massacre in Round Valley, near the Nome Cult Indian farm. The Indians, led on by Mexicans, and some reports say renegade whites, have lately murdered several settlers—in one instance burning their victim at the stake—and driven off a large number of cattle and hogs. The attack on their camp was made on the 13th ult., and according to the most authentic accounts from 140 to 180 Indians were killed, besides several Mexicans. The citizens recovered forty-eight head of horses and a large lot of hogs. Not a single white man was injured.
