PRODUCE ON THE KLAMATH RESERVATION.

—Col. D. E. Buell, Indian Agent of the Klamath Reservation, furnishes the *Crescent City Herald* with the following account of the produce of said Reservation this season:

Acres Wheat	45
Bushels Wheat	1575
Bushels Barley	300
Acres Oats	10
Bushels Peas	1200
Acres Potatoes	28
Bushels Potatoes	8400
Acres Carrots	7
Bushels Carrots	4200

In addition to the above, says the *Herald*, were produced three acres of Beets, very large, and yielding heavily. Also twelve acres of Beans, pumpkins, squashes, &c. &c. We learn that the capacity of this Reservation has been considerably underrated. It has within its borders from eight hundred to one thousand acres of land equal in richness to any in the State, and only needs a liberal supply of funds properly expended, to develop its vast resources. It speaks well for its management, that this, although more sparsely settled with whites, in proportion to Indians than any other section of the State, has no trouble or expense on account of the latter.
