**THE INDIAN WAR.** The news from Oregon is very exciting and important. 300 regulars and 800 volunteers are already in the field, in Oregon alone. In the northern part of this state 500 whites are afoot, armed to the teeth, and breathing vengeance and extermination against the red man. The loss of life among the whites, mostly frontier settlers, has already been very great, and serious fears are entertained that even greater massacres may yet transpire. The number of the hostile Indians is variously estimated at from 5 to 10,000. Every part of the immense territory of Northern California and Oregon is alive with roaming bands of warriors, who murder and destroy every thing in their way.
