

INDIAN AFFAIRS.—Peter Lassen, who has been appointed by Col. Henley to negotiate a treaty of peace with the Pah-Utah and Washoe Indians, has returned to Honey Lake Valley, accompanied by Maj. Isaac Roop and Jonathan Williams, who are also appointed co-agents with him, for the same purpose. They took along with them blankets clothing and various articles, but no provisions. They are, however, instructed to promise the Indians a plenty of flour next season, if their conduct is such as to entitle them to it.
