We are aware that it was necessary to use haste in the matter, and we are satisfied that the company is composed of good men; but we have plenty of as good Indian fighters in the lower end of this county as ever touched a trigger, who would willingly have responded to the call. —and any intimation to the effect that our people have been backward under the circumstances, is in bad taste.
